


#### SADRA BANIASADI

Sadra Baniasadi (b. 1991, Tehran) uses a variety of mediums, including music, video, and storytelling, to reach his audience. He is a graduate of Painting from Tehran University of Art (2015).

Sadra Baniasadi relies on the visual vocabulary of cartoons and book illustrations to mock the contemporary culture. Using elements of pop, mostly taken from the Iranian working class, he creates complex images that play with allegorical narratives and tropes. Between him and the mainstream, between his influences in pop culture and the art scene's fascination with high culture. The tension is the most important drive in Sadra's work.




Sadra Baniasadi. An Ordinary Day. 2024 Oil On Canva. 40 x 40 cm




Sadra Baniasadi. Flow (Opposite Forces). 2025 Oil On Paperboard. 32.5 X 27 cm






Peybak (Peyman Barabadi and Babak Alebrahim Dehkordi, both b. 1984, Tehran, Iran) is the acronym of two artists working together as a "unified duo" since December 20, 2001.

Peybak is well-known for depicting imaginative creatures in a dystopian reverse void. The duo works on every piece together, each taking on different parts until they both declare it finished. Persian poetry, mythology, and miniature painting inspire Peybak's works.

Newsha Tavakolian (b. 1981, Iran) is an acclaimed self-taught Iranian photographer. Starting her career at just 16 years old, she worked for the Iranian press the women's daily newspaper Zan. At 18, she became the youngest photographer to document the significant 1999 student uprising, marking a pivotal moment for both Iran's reformist movement and Tavakolian's own growth as a photojournalist. Later, she joined the prestigious New York-based agency Polaris Images. Recognized for her exceptional talent, Tavakolian became a Magnum nominee in 2015 and an associate in 2017.

Newsha Tavakolian's work reflects the social struggles and contradictions of her time. From regional conflicts to natural disasters, she captures the essence of political and social challenges that emerged in the 20th century and continues to shape the 21st-century world. While initially rooted in photojournalism, Tavakolian has evolved her practice to incorporate photography as art. In the past two decades, she has expanded her professional pursuits, engaging in photography, curation, and video installations that address social concerns in Iran and beyond. Her distinctive style is characterized by color, subdued lighting, and somber atmospheres. Blurring the line between fiction and reality, her works evoke a sense of suspended time, leaving the conquest of the past unresolved and the future uncertain.







Hamid Shams. *He bit first*. 2025 Pinhole photography. 10x15 cm. Edition of 5 +2AP







Bita Fayyazi (b. 1962, Tehran) lives and works in Tehran. More than a sculptor, an installation artist, or ceramicist, engaged in some mystic relationship with her material, Fayyazi is an artist who works within a more performative and markedly social practice.

Bita Fayyazi struggled to show her work amidst an atmosphere of stuffy traditionalism, academicism, and the influx of 1990s conceptual art. Beginning in mid-1990s, her artistic interventions challenged the official definitions of art. Works of Fayyazi are collaborative by nature. She and her artist or non-artist colleagues use whatever material is readily available to wrap and entwine, paint and cast sculptures made of the fabric of social participation. She reconstitutes the energies of the many toward an uncertain resolution. The final object becomes less important than the process – the collective doing, the love of doing – that preceded its creation.

Alborz Kazemi (b. 1989, Tehran, Iran) studied Painting at Tehran's School of Fine Arts. After his graduation, he became more interested in photography and cinema and most of his works have been photography-based.

Kazemi has documented regional press in videos and photographs for years. As a documentarist he has lived with the belief that a photograph is a reference. Skeptical today of this referential hubris, he is now destroying and altering his negatives to reclaim emotions and experiences he feels is lost. Returning to images that he has been storing for years, he realized at some point that there is always a loss in the stutter of a photograph. The fact that a photograph flattens the world of things, its content is at the mercy of many outside forces, and finds new identity in its presentation casts doubt as to the nature of its referential status.





Alborz Kazemi. *Untitled*. N/A C print. 120 x 80 cm






Alborz Kazemi. *Untitled.* 2025 Analog photography printed on fine art paper and collage. 70 x 100 cm





Mehsa Merci (b. 1990 Tehran, Iran) is a multidisciplinary artist based in Canada. She obtained her BA in Graphic Design from Tehran University of Art (2009), her MA in Painting from Azad University of Tehran (2014) and MFA from the University of Manitoba in Canada (2019).

Mahsa Merci works acorss a variety of media – painting, drawing, sculpture, photography, installation, and video – to reflect on marginal identities. In her landscapes, still lifes, and portraits, she goes beyond the "Norm", as one of her untitled paintings reads, to bring forth direct sensual and tactile experience. The grotesque ("X Is Y", "Be Careful, Everything Is Dangerous Here", "Visa Versa", "The Frozen Womb", "The Grudge"), the obscene ("Hairy Triangle", "The Lustful River", "Let Me Grow" series, "Help"), and the bodily ("She", "Half-naked", "Let Me Grow", "Touch Me", "Frozen Hands", "I Feel") play a central role in her work. Her art finds people who are not often represented in society, especially her own experiences as an Iranian woman and a member of the LGBTQ community. Central to her exploration is the duality of identity – the interplay between public personas and private struggles, and the conscious and unconscious aspects of being. Currently, she is delving deeper into the complexities of this dual existence, experimenting with highly textured oil colors on board and incorporating various mediums into her sculptures.




Mahsa Merci. Falling Behind Year. 2025 Acrylic on canvas paper. 8.5x11 inches









Milad Mousavi (b.1987, Tehran, Iran) holds a degree in Economics from Allameh Tabatabai University. He began his professional career in the visual arts in 2012.

He paints and draws using color pencils, acrylic, oil, and pen. He creates a fantastical world inspired by his environment, society, and artistic mediums such as cinema and animation. In his works he mostly depicts himself as the main character giving the paintings a personal narrative tone. Milad Mousavi is a prolific storyteller who reacts to his surroundings and does not restrict himself to limited materials and techniques.




Milad Mousavi. elephant in the dark. 2025 ink on cardboard. 50x35 cm







Milad Mousavi. What is an. 2025 ink on cardboard. 50x35 cm







Milad Mousavi. fingertips. 2025 ink on cardboard. 50x35 cm






Milad Mousavi. *elephant in the room.* 2025 ink on cardboard. 50x35 cm






Farrokh Mahdavi (b. 1970, Tehran, Iran) taught himself painting before studying with master painters and cultivating his passion for the medium. He lives and works in Tehran.

The canvass of Farrokh Mahdavi can be distinguished through the use of unique pinkish hues. His technique aims to defamiliarize the well-known facial elements in a face. The fleshy-pink color of the artist's figures allows the rendering of "a more general depiction of human beings devoid of stereotypes of gender and race". The faces in Mahdavi's work are reduced to such features as the eyes or the lips, and the rest are covered by thick layers of pink paint, hinting at the emotional world of his characters. He tries to specify forms and conditions without directly depicting anything additional to that, as he believes it deviates from the main point.
