PRESS RELEASE

Dastan's presentation at Frieze Los Angeles 2026 brings together twelve artists ranging from emerging to established, offering a cross-generational view of contemporary Iranian art and its diasporic extensions. While each practice maintains a distinct visual language and conceptual trajectory, the booth underscores a continuum of artistic inquiry shaped by shared histories, inherited narratives, and evolving formal vocabularies.

Amid the current struggles and complexities surrounding Iran, this presentation also takes on an added resonance. Without reducing the works to a singular statement, Dastan approaches this moment as an opportunity to create visibility, to hold space, and to affirm the multiplicity of voices that constitute Iranian artistic production today. In doing so, the booth serves not only as an exhibition platform, but as a gesture of presence asserting that contemporary Iranian art continues to think, speak, and imagine beyond constraint.

The presentation has been created with the support and curatorial supervision of Kour Pour (b. 1987). Kour's vision in bringing communities together is evident in his open approach to the artistic direction and design of Dastan's booth.

The circulating setting of the booth includes work by Ali Akbar Sadeghi (b. 1937, Tehran, Iran), Farideh Lashai (b. 1944 Rasht – d. 2013, Tehran, Iran), Farrokh Mahdavi (b. 1970, Tehran, Iran), Asad Faulwell (b. 1982, Caldwell, Idaho, USA), Mamali Shafahi (b. 1982, Tehran, Iran), Peybak (Peyman Barabadi & Babak Alebrahim Dehkordi, b. 1984, Tehran, Iran), Maryam Ayeen & Abbas Shahsavar (b. 1985, Bojnord; b. 1983, Kermanshah, Iran), Hoda Kashiha (b. 1986, Iran), Haniko Zahra (b. 1989, Tehran, Iran), Yousha Bashir (b. 1989, Manila, Philippines), Roksana Pirouzmand (b. 1990, Yazd, Iran), and Aryana Minai (b. 1994, Los Angeles, USA). This is Dastan's fourth participation at Frieze Los Angeles.



ALI AKBAR SADEGHI

Ali Akbar Sadeghi (b. 1937, Tehran, Iran) is an iconic figure in Iran's art history, celebrated for his various contributions across multiple artistic disciplines. An established master known around the world, he continues new directions in his art. He graduated from the Fine Art Faculty at the University of Tehran during its golden age, a time when many remarkable Iranian artists flourished. Sadeghi blended elements and motifs of traditional Iranian painting with modern art, creating a unique visual language that has been a source of influence for young artists across generations.

Ali Akbar Sadeghi started his artistic career as an illustrator. He worked with various newspapers and magazines, including the "Asia" newspaper. He designed several movie posters and created stained-glass murals for Tehran's Roudaki Hall. Alongside other artists, he co-founded the Film and Animation Department at the Institute for the Intellectual Development of Children and Young Adults in 1970. He illustrated numerous books, winning first prize in Asia's best illustrations category for "Hero of Champions," created several animations, and participated in more than 50 film and book festivals.

In 1977, he set aside filmmaking to make painting his primary medium. Considering himself a storyteller, paintings of Sadeghi are intricately detailed, bustling with energy and characters, and they are often large-scale. His colorful, dream-like narratives draw from the Qahveh-Khanh ("Coffee-house") painting traditions, Iranian miniatures, and Western surrealism. Self-portraiture holds a special place in his wide range of paintings and sculptures. His strong presence as a storyteller demonstrates his focus not only on reviving traditions but also on personalizing the histories of both Iranian and Western art. With this approach, he weaves the past and the present, the real and the fantastical, and the visual and the sociopolitical together to create works that keep the viewer's gaze engaged indefinitely.

FARIDEH LASHAI

Farideh Lashai (1944–2013) was an Iranian contemporary artist known for her diverse body of work, spanning painting, drawing, and video art. Born in Rasht, Iran, Lashai began her artistic career in the 1960s and gained recognition for her contributions to the Iranian art scene.

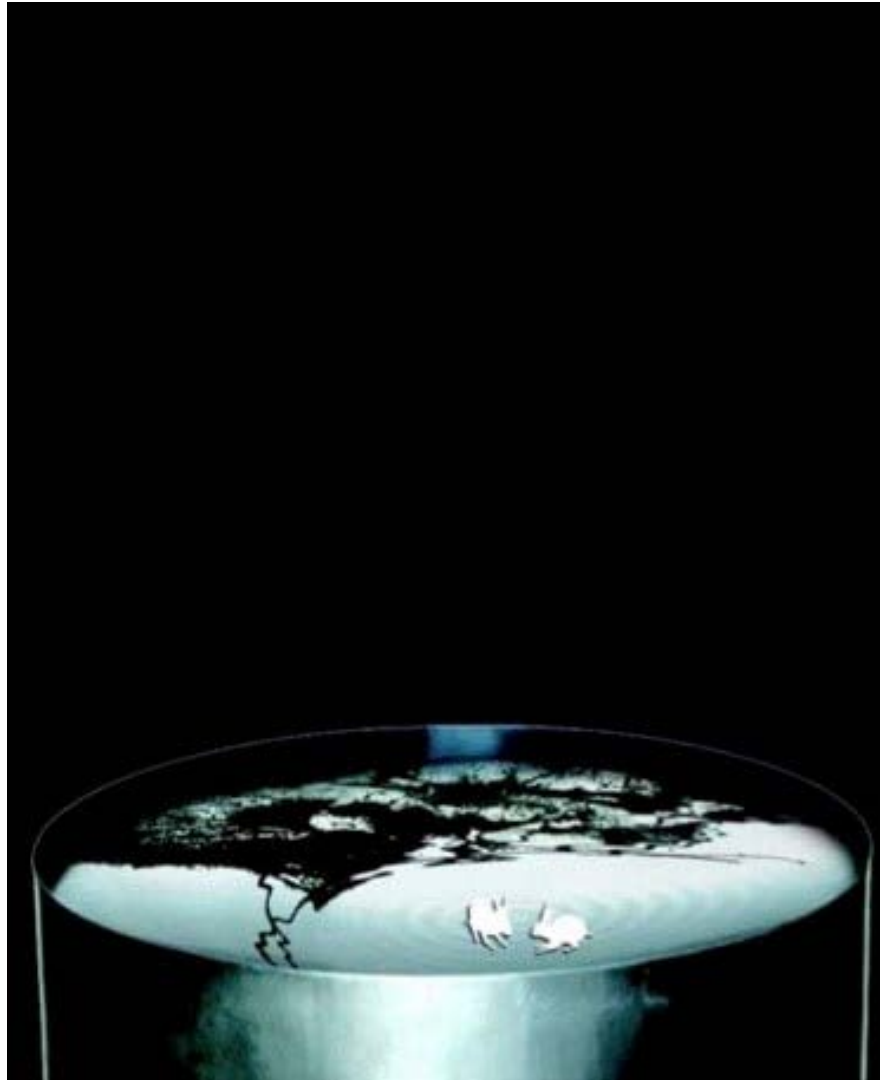
Her works often explore themes of memory, identity, and the human condition. Lashai's later years saw a shift towards multimedia installations, and she became internationally acclaimed for her innovative approach to art. Notably, her video installation, "When I Count, There Are Only You... But When I Look, There Is Only a Shadow" (2013), gained widespread attention. Lashai's legacy endures as she continues to be celebrated for her significant impact on contemporary art in Iran and beyond.

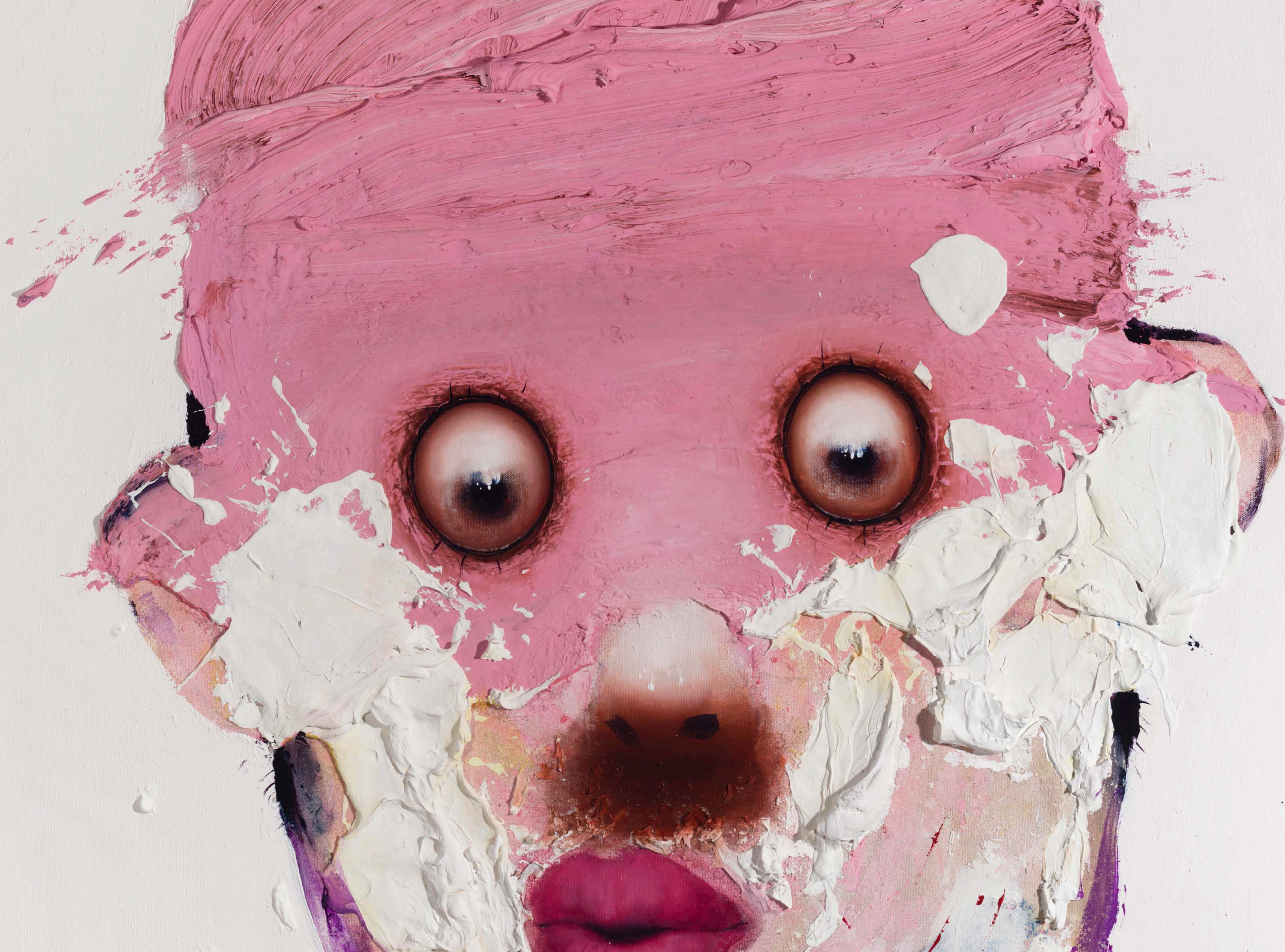
FARROKH MAHDABI

Farrokh Mahdavi (b. 1970, Tehran, Iran) taught himself painting before studying with master painters and cultivating his passion for the medium. He lives and works in Tehran.

Canvases of Farrokh Mahdavi can be distinguished through unique pinkish hues. His technique aims to defamiliarize the well-known facial elements in a face. The fleshy-pink color of the artist's figures allows the rendering of "a more general depiction of human beings devoid of stereotypes of gender and race." The faces in Mahdavi's work are reduced to features like the eyes or the lips, and the rest are covered by thick layers of pink paint, hinting at the emotional world of his characters. He tries to specify forms and conditions without directly depicting anything additional, as he believes it deviates from the main point.

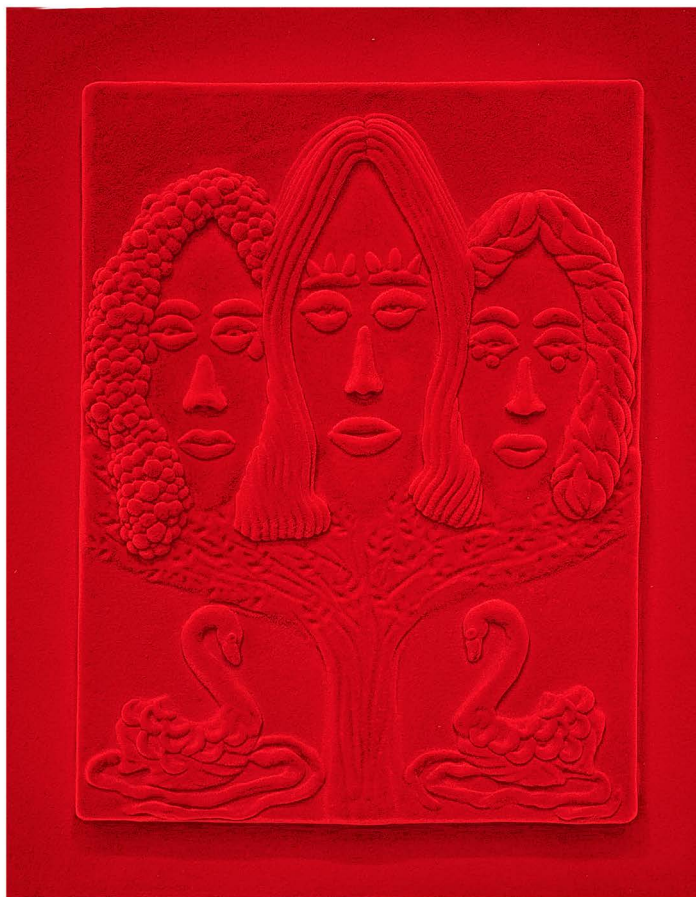


MAMALI SHAFahi

Mamali Shafahi (b. 1982, based in Paris and Tehran) is a filmmaker and visual artist known for his immersive, mixed-media installations that combine sound and light to create visual feasts adorned with enigmatic chimeras that defy categorization. His works reflect the complexities of cultural diversity and identity, shattering stereotypes and inviting viewers to explore the richness beneath the surface. Rooted in his Iranian heritage, they offer an escape into realms of fantasy, seamlessly blending the magical with the terrifying, and fantasy with horror, all within a mesmerizing world of optical illusions. As part of his long-term project Daddy Sperm, Shafahi created the experimental docu-fiction film *Nature Morte*, featuring his parents. This work became the backbone of an installation at City Princes/ ses at the Palais de Tokyo in Paris in 2019. His VR collaboration with Ali Eslami, *nerd_funk*, has been showcased at Het Nieuwe Instituut (Rotterdam), the Vancouver Biennale, and IDFA, earning the Golden Calf for Best Interactive Film at the Netherlands Film Festival. Following this success, he was a guest resident at the Rijksakademie in Amsterdam. In 2024, Shafahi embarked on a collaboration with his partner Domenico Gutknecht (b. 1987), titled *Rest in Peace*, further expanding his multidisciplinary practice.

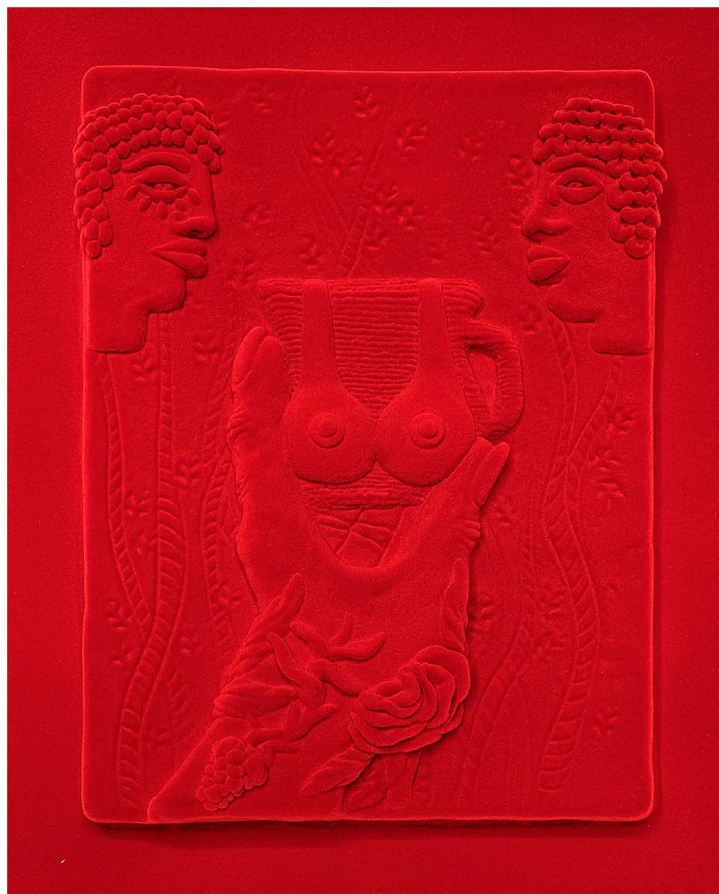


Mamali Shafahi. "Phantasmagoria, Bat". 2025
Flocked epoxy clay. 50 x 40 x 10 cmm



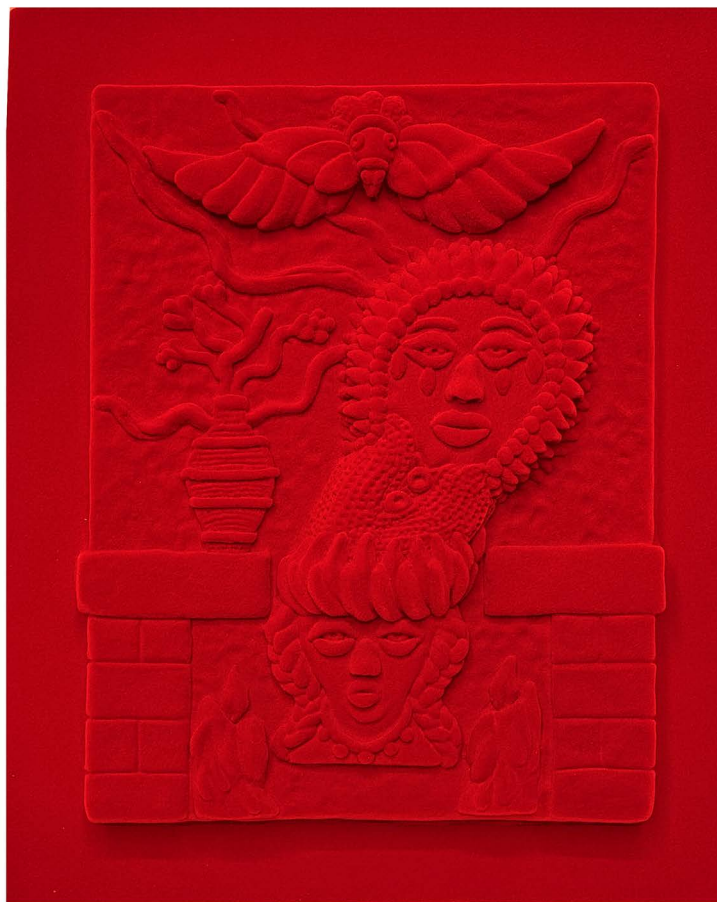
Mamali Shafahi. "Echoes of Euphoria, Tree of life". 2025

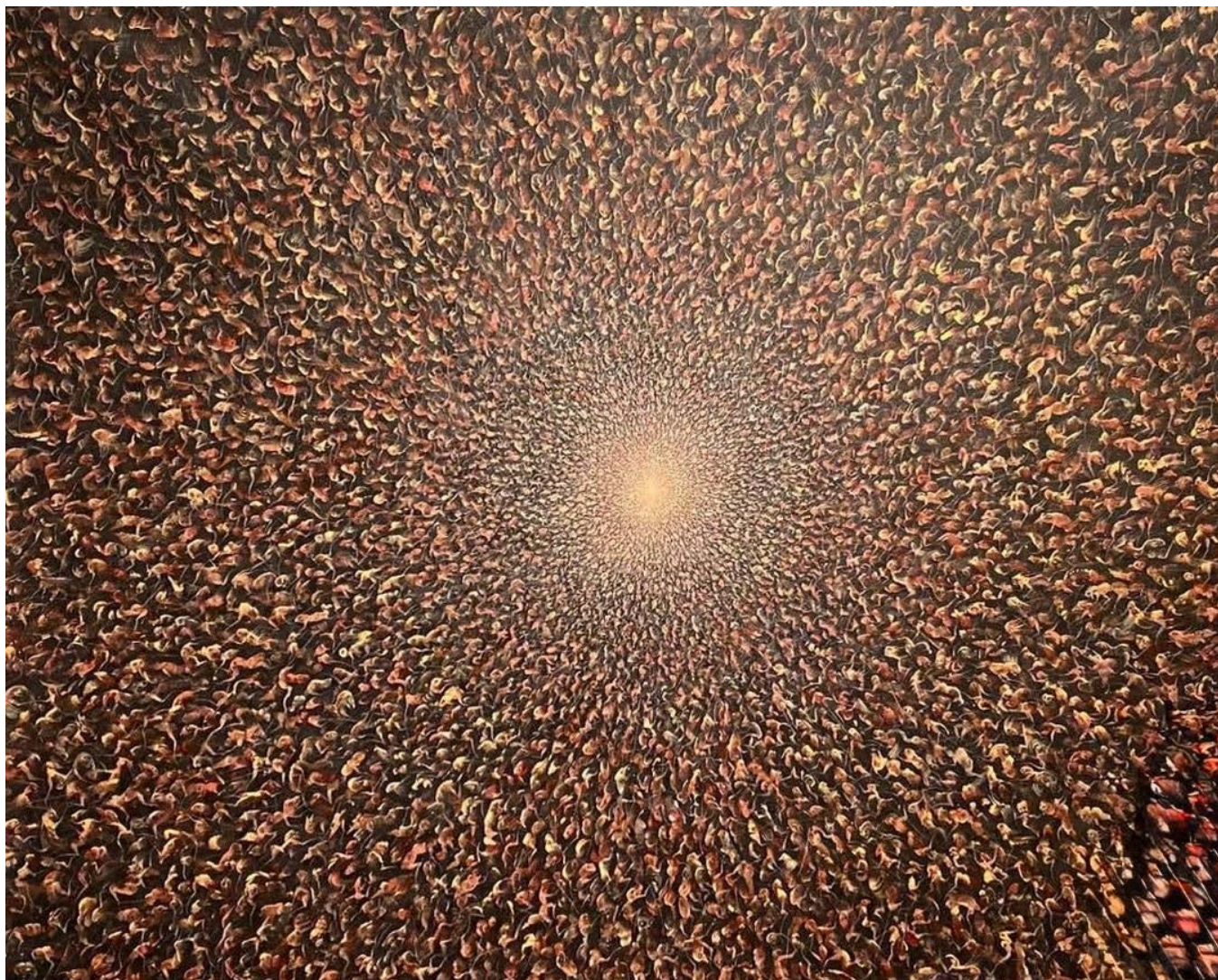

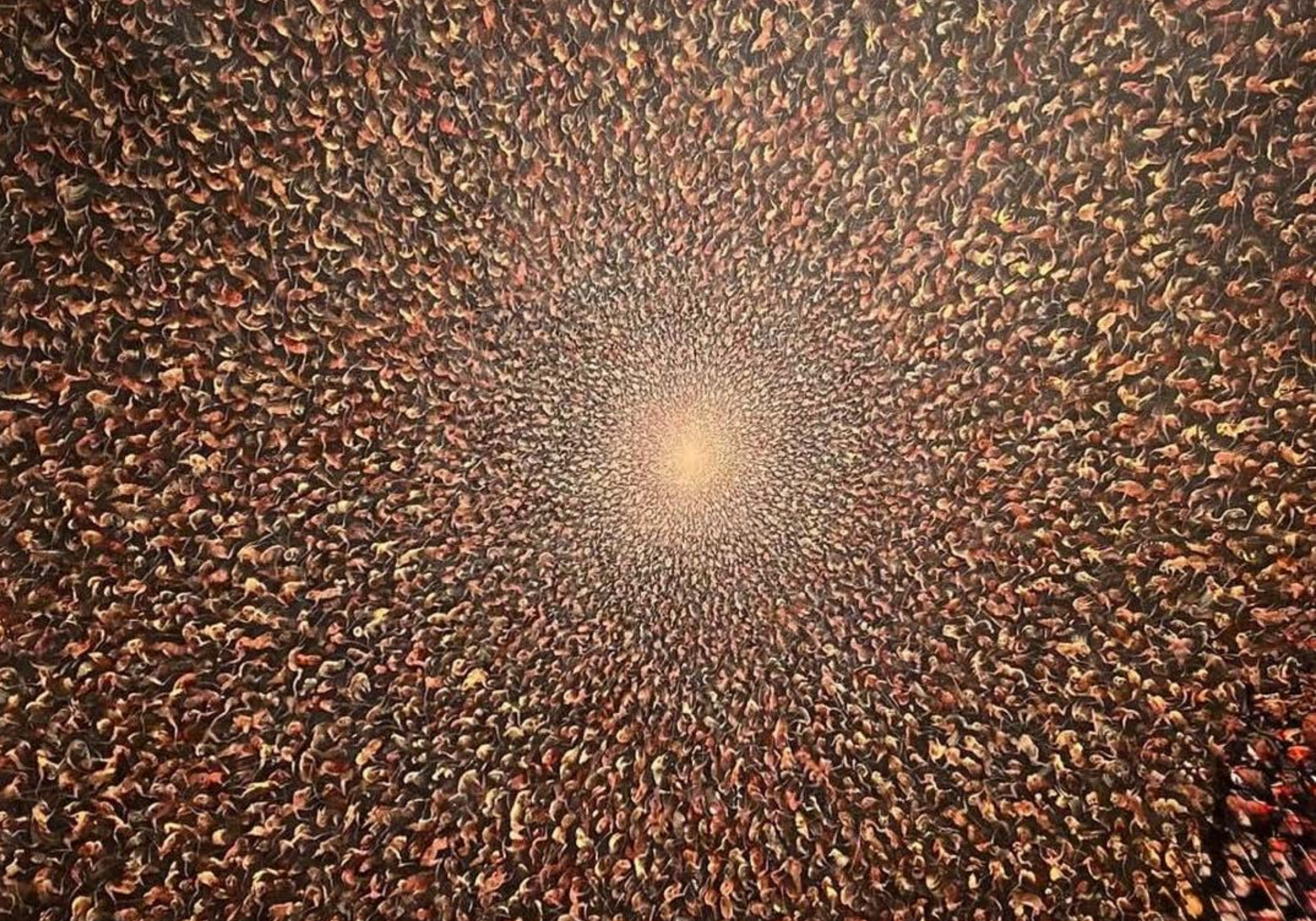
PEYBAK

Peybak (Peyman Barabadi and Babak Alebrahim Dehkordi, both b. 1984, Tehran, Iran) is the pseudonym of two artists have been working together as the "unified duo" of Peybak since December 20, 2001. Peybak is well-known for depicting imaginative creatures in a dystopian reverse void. The duo works on every piece together, each taking on different parts until they both declare it finished. Persian poetry, mythology, and miniature painting inspire Peybak's works.

MARYAM AYEEN & ABBAS SHAHSAVAR

Maryam Ayeen (b.1985, Bojnourd, Iran) and Abbas Shahsavar (b.1983, Kermanshah, Iran) have been painting together for over a decade. Ayeen holds a BA in Painting (Ferdowsi University, Mashhad, 2009). Shahsavar holds a BA in painting (Ferdowsi University, Mashhad, 2005) and an MA in the same field (University of Arts, 2012). Their work follows an old tradition in Persian miniature painting. They live, teach, and paint in the city of Mashhad, Iran. Together, they form an Iranian artist duo whose work is rooted in the visual language of Persian miniature painting. While their technical approach draws on the delicate brushwork and compositional refinement of traditional book arts, their subject matter is distinctly contemporary – ranging from scenes of middle-class life and domestic interiors to psychological, social, and political tensions embedded within private experience.

Their joint works often depict suspended moments within staged interiors, using recurring motifs and symbolic elements to explore themes such as routine, control, and isolation. The pair works closely on all aspects of the painting process, merging perspectives to develop a cohesive visual language marked by compositional density and formal precision. Their practice resists nostalgia, instead positioning miniature painting as a living form capable of addressing present-day realities through sustained attention to medium, form, and shared authorship.

Prior to forming their collaborative practice, Ayeen and Shahsavar each pursued independent artistic careers, with solo and group exhibitions. Recent collaborative presentations include “The Soft Edge of the Blade, Vol. 3” at Leila Heller Gallery, Dubai (2025); Art Dubai, represented by Dastan’s Basement (2024); “Arches of Agony” at Guest House, Los Angeles (2023); and “A Nostalgic Glimpse” at X Homa, Tehran (2022)

HODA KASHIHA

Hoda Kashiha (b. 1986, Tehran, Iran) is a graduate of Painting from the University of Tehran (BA, 2009) and Boston University (MFA, 2014). She works and lives in Tehran.

Works of Hoda Kashiha bounce between everyday life and the imagery she sets out to produce. Through the use of non-linear narrative, dark humor, and mythological, religious, and modern icons, the artist meets with difficult moments in her personal and political life. Drawing from a variety of references – "from Malevich to Instagram" – she composes her fragmented narratives. Kashiha uses digital tools to first draw a work and then construct it on canvas, layer upon layer. Nevertheless, this way of fragmenting motifs deals with major contemporary subjects such as persisting gender relations. The body plays an important role in many of the artist's works. It's through the body that she relates to the world, becomes aware of her desires, and constructs an identity. Drawing the body not only projects her personal life but also the external world. Being interested in man and woman interaction, she uses various tools (airbrush, i-Pad, stencil) and subjects (body fragments, geometric abstraction) that affect an ambiguity that separates traditional definitions of male-female, resulting in gender fluidity.

YOUSHA BASHIR

Yousha Bashir (b. 1989, Manila, Philippines) is a multidisciplinary artist living in Tehran. He has a degree in Computer Graphics Design and a BA in Visual Arts from the University of Farhangian in Tehran.

Bashir is a dynamic artist whose work has gone through significant transformations in style and output. His works focus on the relational study of form, the frame (the viewer's perception), and the space surrounding it, challenging the traditional framework of painting by exploring the intersection between the digital and physical realms. His vibrant and luminous imagery questions the definition of creative space in the digital age, particularly the role of digital technology in expanding the conceptual boundaries of landscapes.

In his latest series, *Infinite Horizons*, Bashir continues to investigate the complexities of translating digital images into physical paintings. This series reflects his recognition of human imperfection and the absence of absolute perfection. Through fluid brushstrokes and gradations of color, he captures the possibility of missteps in landscape painting, putting it in contrast with the precision of cutting-edge technology. Bashir's use of light brings balance to color arrangements and infuses a sense of movement into the landscape. The result is a deeper exploration of construction, duality, and suspension, where both the physical and digital worlds merge, evoking new perspectives on space and depth.

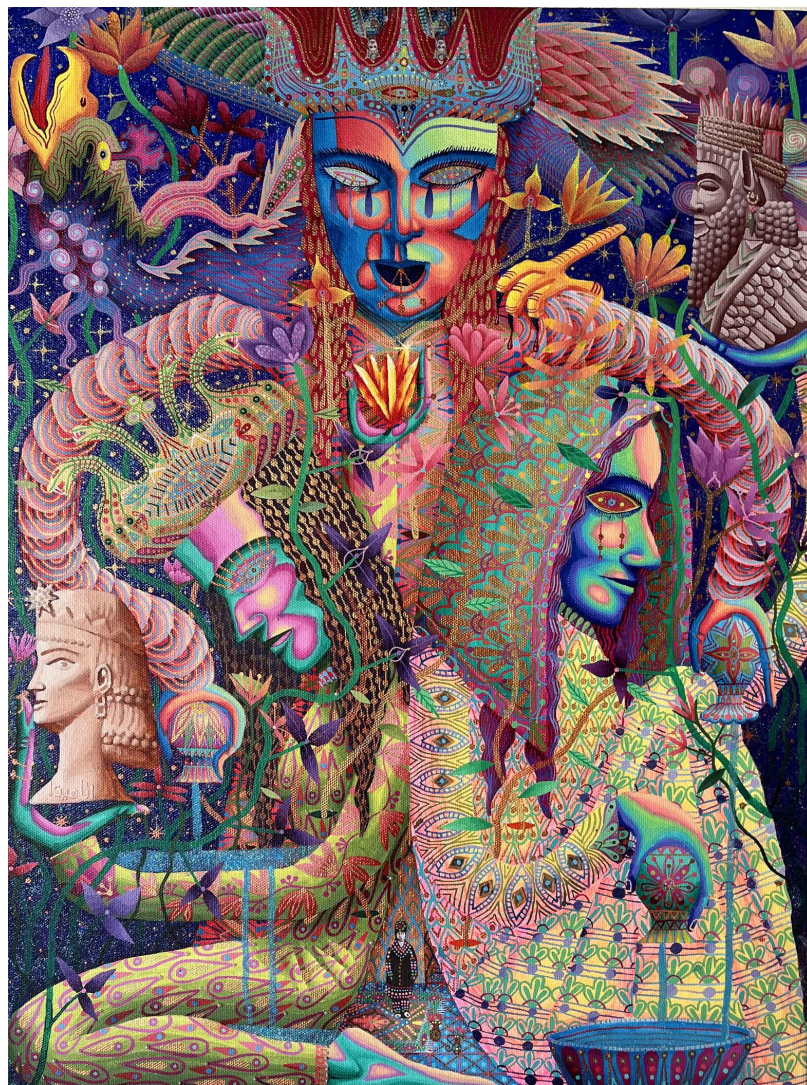
Bashir's work has evolved from sculpture and installations to a more focused exploration of painting. Key themes such as the expansion of digital landscapes, the redefinition of spatial perception, and the interplay between light and shadow shape his recent creations. His works often blur the boundaries between virtual and physical realms, inviting viewers to experience shifting layers of space and form. Through this progression, Bashir continues to explore how digital and traditional mediums can challenge and redefine the viewer's perception of landscape and space.
