

MARYAMAYEEN& ABASS SHAHSAWAR


Maryam Ayeen (b. 1985, Bojnoord, Iran) holds a BA in Painting from Ferdowsi University (Mashhad, Iran). Her work follows an old tradition in Persian miniature painting.

Abbas Shahsavar (b.1983, Kermanshah, Iran) holds a B.A. in Painting from Ferdowsi University (2005) and an M.A. in Painting from University of Arts (2012).

Maryam Ayeen and Abbas Shahsavar are an Iranian artist duo whose collaborative practice is rooted in the visual language of Persian miniature painting. While their technical approach draws on the delicate brushwork and compositional refinement of traditional book arts, their subject matter is distinctly contemporary—ranging from scenes of middleclass life and domestic interiors to psychological, social, and political tensions embedded within private experience.

Their joint works often depict suspended moments within staged interiors, using recurring motifs and symbolic elements to explore themes such as routine, control, and isolation. The pair works closely on all aspects of the painting process, merging perspectives to develop a cohesive visual language marked by compositional density and formal precision. Their practice resists nostalgia, instead positioning miniature painting as a living form capable of addressing present-day realities through sustained attention to medium, form, and shared authorship.








Maryam Ayeen & Abbas Shahsavar. *Untitled.* 2020 Gouache and Watercolor on Paper. 16 × 11 cm
